

Burton Village Council Minutes  
10 April 2017

Mayor Koster called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

Roll Call: Charles Boehnlein – Yes, Tom Blair – Yes, Roberta Dobay – Yes, Craig Ronyak – Yes, Joe Hernandez – Yes, Nick Tromba - Yes.

Visitors: Lee Koroshes, Jane Koroshes, Pat Linn Jack Garner, Joe Koziol, Tom Erickson, Nick Fischbach, Marcianne Kimpton.

Mayor Koster asked for a motion to approve or amend the minutes of 27 March 2017. Mr. Ronyak moved to approve the minutes as written and Mr. T. Blair seconded the motion. By voice vote the motion passed.

Mayor Koster asked for a motion to adopt or amend the agenda for the Council Meeting of 10 April 2017. Mr. Boehnlein moved to adopt the agenda as written and Mr. Ronyak seconded the motion. By voice vote, motion approved.

**Fiscal Officers Report:**

Mr. Paquette reported that the Summary of Revenue and Expenses was presented and he would answer any questions posed. Council had none. Mr. Paquette informed Council that the State Audit of finances would take place the last two weeks of April and the first week of May. Mayor Koster asked for a motion to accept the Fiscal Officers report. Mr. Boehnlein moved to accept the Fiscal Officers report and Mr. Ronyak seconded the motion. By voice vote the motion passed.

Mayor Koster asked for a motion to accept and pay approved invoices. Mr. Boehnlein moved to accept and pay the approved invoices. Mr. Ronyak seconded the motion. By voice vote the motion passed.

**Ordinances and Resolutions**

Mr. Paquette placed Ordinance 2314-17, establishing a Utility Tap-in Policy for utility consumers outside the Village of Burton, on second reading.

**Mayors Report**

Mayor Koster had nothing to report.

**Old Business**

Mayor Koster asked if Council had any old business. Mayor Koster asked Ms. Dobay about flowers. She stated that they have been ordered. Mayor Koster asked Mr. Hernandez about the Historic District Architectural Review Board and the Burton Volunteer Fire Department. Mr. Hernandez stated that the situation had not changed. Mayor Koster asked Mr. Tromba about trash hauling. Mr. Tromba mentioned that he met with WasteManagement and was reviewing the information.

## **New Business**

Mr. Paquette brought a letter from the Burton Chamber of Commerce to the attention of the Mayor. The Chamber requested that the Village water the hanging baskets around the Village this season. The Chamber will purchase the baskets and provide the fertilizer to the Village. Mayor Koster asked Mr. Paquette for a letter to Chamber thanking them. Mr. Boehnlein moved to agree to have the Village employees water the hanging baskets using fertilizer provided. Mr. Ronyak seconded the motion. By voice vote the motion passed.

## **Open Public Participation**

Mayor Koster recognized Mr. Fischbach. Mr. Fischbach asked for more information about the single hauler trash pickup. Mayor Koster stated that the rate could be reduced, choice of pickup days was getting limited, and residents would gain curbside recycling. Mr. Fischbach wanted to know who pays for reimbursement of those residents with long term contracts should the provider change. Mayor Koster stated that the Rumpke representative had provided an explanation of rebate process that ensured that the customer was covered. Ms. Dobay indicated that she understand that the repayment process was a stated mandated requirement when a municipality adopted a contract that superseded individual contracts. Mr. Fischbach wanted to know if the public would be able to participate in the discussion. Mayor Koster stated that they would continue to listen to public comment. Mr. Hernandez thanked Mr. Fischbach for his comments and assured him they would be considered in the discussion. Ms. Dobay mentioned the fact that there could be more options than just the single cart. Bags could be available. Mr. Garner stated that he uses bags and wanted Council to understand that it would be more expensive for him, at least as far as what he understood from the Middlefield proposal. Mayor Koster stated that the Council was considering options that would be for the good of the Village.

Mayor Koster recognized Mr. Koroshes. Mr. Koroshes complained about the cars parked on Goodwin between Hickox and Main Street, effectively making Goodwin one lane wide. Mr. Koroshes asked that Council do something about people parking on the street such as closing the street to any on street parking.

Mr. Koroshes stated that he observed a Tractor Trailer truck turn too sharply from North Cheshire onto Goodwin. The right hand turn caused the truck to strike the power pole on the southeast corner and blow a tire on the trailer. Mr. Koroshes suggested that extra signs be placed south of the corner reminding truck drivers to take the turn wide. Mayor Koster stated that too many signs distracted drivers. The Chief of Police is working on it.

Mr. Koroshes mentioned the flashing school light at his property isn't working properly.

Mr. Koroshes invited all of Council to attend the Easter Egg hunt on Saturday as it will be his last one. Mayor Koster asked if anyone had volunteered to take over. Mrs. Koroshes stated a couple of people had expressed interest.

Mrs. Kimpton asked why the trucks couldn't be made to go the other direction from Burton Station. Mayor Koster noted in turn that trucks were using Peckham. Mr. Koroshes thought we could control that because the Village was responsible for half the road. Mr. Paquette pointed out that Peckham road was entirely in Burton Township, with the Village boundary ending at the berm.

Mayor Koster stated that he will have the Chief of Police look into it further.

Mr. Boehnlein moved to adjourn at 7:35 PM and Mr. Ronyak seconded the motion. By voice vote, motion approved.
